# NOTES on KEYNOTES

## Dr. Deborah L. Butler Thursday keynote

Professor, Faculty of Education  
University of British Columbia

“Learning and Transformation: Empowering Teachers and Students”

In her keynote presentation, Dr. Butler will build from 20 years of research and practice to stimulate thinking about ways in which teachers and students can be empowered to navigate, embrace and influence change. She will offer a powerful conceptual framework for understanding how students and teachers can take and feel in control over their own learning and development (as students and practitioners) within the environments in which they find themselves. She will also highlight concrete ways in which students and teachers can be supported to feel and take ownership over learning/practice, and to experience agency and control through personal, contextual, professional and/or systems change.

## Shirley Swelchalot Shxwha:yathel Hardman

### *Storytelling*

Shirley Hardman currently holds the position of Vice President Academic Office, University of the Fraser Valley, where she is also **Senior Advisor on Indigenous Affairs**.

Enrolled in a PhD in Educational Studies (UBC) with a focus on Aboriginal post secondary education policy, she continues to engage in on-going personal and professional development. She possesses a commitment to cultural safety, integrating Aboriginal worldviews in curriculum and pedagogies, Aboriginal student success, & building partnerships. She has over 25 years experience working with Aboriginal organizations, government agencies and education institutes. She has been a sessional instructor in graduate education programs at the Lower Mainlands foremost universities. “Teachers as Agents of Change” is but one of myriad themes in her cadre of teaching. Shirley has authored many publications and has spoken at conferences across North America for over a decade. She is the Chair of the Skemcis Medicine Lodge Society and a member of the Sto:lo Community Futures Board of Directors.

## Jody Paterson Friday keynote

Jody is an award-winning journalist who has been writing for B.C. newspapers and magazines for 25 years. In her 15 years working at the Victoria Times-

Colonist, she held virtually every newsroom job - from beat reporter to managing editor - and has been a columnist for the paper since 1996. She left her full-time job in 2004 to become executive director of the Prostitutes Empowerment Education and Resource Society (PEERS), but continued to write a weekly opinion column.

There aren't many topics that Paterson hasn't written about at one point or another in her career, but social issues - particularly homelessness, addiction and sex work - have been her passion for the last decade. Her three years at PEERS gave her a front-line view of the challenges, and in the summer of 2007 she was selected to be on the steering committee of the Mayor's Task Force on Breaking the Cycle of Homelessness and Addiction. Paterson hopes to play an ongoing role in finding solutions for the 1,500 people living on or near the streets in Victoria.

Paterson is now self-employed as a writer, communications strategist and event planner. Read her column every Friday on the TC opinion pages for a thoughtful but passionate look at the issues that matter in our community.
